The Paper Campaign Intern will work to reach the public and environmental advocates through tabling, meetings and literature. Responsibilities include developing, refining and distributing campaign outreach materials; representing Dogwood Alliance by tabling at festivals, events and schools and identifying events for tabling and speaking. Research Intern

This intern will work closely with the National Organizer to reduce the pressure on southern forests for the production of disposable paper products by developing a deeper knowledge base about the recycling market in the South. This type of information deepens our understanding of the challenges on the supply end of transforming the paper market to relieve pressure on southern forests. Responsibilities include conducting research on the recycling industry, availability of raw material (i.e. waste paper) in the region, and documenting paper mills in the region.
